## WHERE CAN I RECYCLE?



Recycling drop off bins are found in many convenient locations around Randolph County. The bins are "single stream" which means no sorting is required. Recycling should be clean, dry, and not in plastic bags - in other words, loose. Cardboard should be broken down.

- Paper, junk mail, magazines and newspaper
- Cardboard, broken down and flattened
- All colors of glass bottles and jars
- Aluminum, tin or steel food and beverage containers

- Shredded paper (see website for events dates)
- Furniture, clothing and toys

- Used electronics (anything with a cord) \$10.00 charge for any TV 25" or larger.
- Fluorescent bulbs

- Used automotive fluids
- Garage chemicals
- Batteries (No alkaline see pg. 18-19 on how to recycle batteries).
- Used tires (on specially designated tire collection days. Call for next collection date).
- Flammables gasoline, kerosene
- Household appliances

Call the business office to verify dates that Pollution Solution is open or for alternative places to take HHW during the winter while Pollution Solution is closed.

## WHAT IS HHW?



What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)? It is any substance that is toxic, flammable, corrosive, reactive, infectious or radioactive. Examples: oil based paint, gasoline, fertilizer, paint thinner, some glues, oils and many other items found in your home, garden or garage. See our webpage for an extensive list of HHW items and instructions for disposal.

#### Some Helpful Tips for HHW:

- Read the label and follow the directions!
- Pay attention to warning labels and keep toxic substances away from children, pets, water sources and wildlife.
- Buy only what you need, use it up or give it to someone else to use up.
- Always dispose of properly and store according to label instructions.
- Never dump leftovers in the drain or on the ground.
- Do not ever burn, bury or throw in the trash.
- Do not remove label from container.

# LATEX PAINT DISPOSAL

Latex paint is non-toxic and stable and can be thrown in the trash ONCE IT IS DRY. The best way to dry paint is to mix in sawdust, kitty litter or mulch. Once the paint is no longer liquid, put the lid back on and place the paint can in your regular trash receptacle. *See district website for video instructions.*

## WHAT DO I DO WITH IT?

US flags that have become old and torn can be taken to any American Legion Post in the county, Lynn City Building, or the Corner Cupboard Hallmark in Union City. Collected flags will be retired with all due respect by the Boy Scouts of America.



Used printer cartridges can be dropped off at the Randolph County YMCA for recycling.





Eyeglasses and hearing aids can be dropped off in Lions Club collection boxes located at Winchester Family Eye Care, 882 E Greenville Pike, Winchester or Midwest Eye Consultants at 310 S Oak, Winchester and in the Parker City Building.

Aluminum cans can be sold to Jay-Randolph Development at 974 E Base Road, Winchester, where the funds received for the cans are used to support JRD programs. Cans may also be donated to the PAWS Animal Shelter in Union City where funds are used to help care for the animals. Aluminum cans can also be placed in recycling bins.





Expired medications can be taken to the Randolph County Health Department, 325 S Oak, Suite 202, Winchester, for disposal. Several local municipalities have drop off boxes at law enforcement offices. Sharps may be brought to the RCHD if they are in approved containers. See district website for instructions for throwing sharps in the trash properly.

Styrofoam packing peanuts can be kept for reuse or thrown in the trash. Some packing peanuts are now being made from materials that are compostable or that will dissolve in water. Check and see if they will dissolve before throwing them away.

**Trash service:** Residential trash pick up is handled by the City of Winchester Sanitation Department. Residents may contact the Clerk-Treasurers office at 765-584-6845 x 2303 to sign up for trash services.

Large item pick up: Residents must schedule pick up of large items by contacting the Clerk-Treasurer's office. Large items are picked up the first and third Thursday of each month. See city website for list of allowable items.

**City dumpster:** The city dumpster is open on the third Saturday of every month from 9am-12pm. Only Winchester residents are permitted to dump and must show proof of residency. permitted. No construction material, chemicals, or electronics. Yard and garden waste is allowed Monday through Friday from 7am to 7pm and must be placed in the designated location.

Yard and garden waste: Picked up by the Winchester Street Department. Pick up is done on the same day as your trash pick up. Waste must be in bags. Large materials must be neatly stacked. Leaf collection will occur in the fall. Leaves must be raked to the curb or may be put in bags and set at curb. Questions can be directed to the Street Department at 765-584-2764 ext. 3200.

**Expired Medications:** May be dropped off in the collection box in the City Building or Randolph County Health Department.


**Trash service:** Residential trash pick up is provided by Best Way of Indiana. Sign up for service at the Parker City town office. Trash pick up day is Wednesday

Large item pick up: Residents must call the Parker City town office to schedule a large item pick up. Pick up day is the first Thursday of the month.

Leaf collection: Provided in the fall by the Street Department.

**Expired medications:** May be dropped off in the collection box in the Parker City town building.

## TOWN OF FARMLAND





**Trash service:** Residential trash pick up is provided by Best Way of Indiana. Sign up for service at the Farmland town office. Trash pick up day is Thursday.

Large item pick up: Residents must call Best Way at 1-800-745-5714 to schedule a large item pick up. Pick up day is the first Thursday of the month.

Yard and garden waste: May be taken to the burn pile behind the fire station. No treated wood and waste must be dumped on pile without the plastic bag.

**Leaf collection:** Residents will receive a phone call notice, and leaf collection information will be posted on the town Facebook page.

**Expired medications:** May be brought to the city building where it will be turned over to the police.

**Trash service:** Residential trash service is provided by Best Way of Indiana. Service begins when residents sign up for water and sewer in the Union City town office.

**Large item pick up:** Residents must call Best Way at 1-800-745-5714 to schedule a large item pick up. Pick up day is the first Wednesday of the month.

Large dumpsters: Located at the Street Department lot for Union City, IN residents for trash or large items. Please stop by the City Clerk's office for a no-cost ticket. No tires, electronics or hazardous materials. No more than a standard 1/2 ton pick up load. Lot is located at 424 S Howard Street.

**City-wide clean up day**: Held on the weekend prior to Memorial Day. Yard and garden waste may be taken to the Street Department lot at 426 S Howard at any time.

Leaf collection is provided in the fall by the Street Department.

**Expired medications:** Can be dropped in the medication drop in the city Police Department drop box at 219 S Howard.

### **OUR MISSION**

Is to provide recycling services, opportunities to properly dispose of household hazardous waste and offer environmental education, programs, and presentations to the residents of Randolph County, Indiana.



Twice a year, the District hosts a paper shred event free of cost for Randolph County residents.

The District offers a Community Grant program where non-profits, schools and government entities may apply for funds to help further environmental causes or projects which benefit the community and are constructed of recycled or reused materials.

Education grants are offered to all third and fourth grade classrooms for projects, activities, field trips or other endeavors which teach students about the 3 R's (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) and to be good stewards of our natural resources. We also offers scholarships to county seniors who will be pursuing environmental studies in college.



Two tire collection events are held at Pollution Solution every year. Cost for tire disposal is \$1/per tire for all tires other than tractor tires which are \$10.00 each.

Although Pollution Solution is closed during the winter, the District will hold a Post Holiday Electronics Drop Off on one Saturday in January for county residents to properly dispose of unwanted electronics.

# Do not recycle alkaline batteries!



Recycle all rechargeable including those found in cordless tools, Ni-Cad, lithium ion, Ni-MH, button or any other specialty battery.

"Button batteries" of all sizes. Wrap them in tape before placing in the collection box.

All rechargeable, Ni-Cad, lithium, cadmium or any other specialty battery should be disposed of properly. Cover the terminals with tape before placing the batteries in the collection box.

Today's alkaline batteries are much safer than those in the past and can be simply thrown in the trash.

Simply bring your items in, follow instructions at the recycling center, or garden center, and Lowe's will take care of the rest.
