Randolph County Recycling District

Community and Education Grants

A total of \$17,495.00 was distributed in community and educational grants throughout 2023. These grants went to fund a wide variety of projects around the county.

- Fountain Park Cemetery was awarded \$1,500.00 for trees to help replace the many aging and dead trees in the cemetery.
- The town of Parker City was awarded \$615.00 to further work on their community garden.
- Girl Scout Brownie Troop 520 was awarded \$2,000.00 to purchase camping supplies and other equipment to help them in outdoor education and trash clean up projects.
- Randolph County YMCA received \$630.00 for supplies for summer camp programs and projects which teach children about the importance of recycling and waste reduction.
- The Journey Home received \$500.00 to cover the cost of soil, hoses, fertilizer and other garden needs to continue the use of their raised garden beds.
- Lee Driver Middle School received \$1,600.00 to build raised garden beds for use in 8th grade science classes.
- Monroe Central Elementary School received \$2,000.00 to help create an outdoor learning space for use by all the classes at the school.
- The City of Winchester received a grant of \$3,000.00 to fund picnic tables made from recycled plastic to use in the new city splash pad area of the pool.
- The Union City Shark Swim Team received \$1,500.00 to purchase swim fins made from recycled plastic for use of the children who swim at the city swimming pool.
- The Purdue Extension of Randolph County received a grant of \$1,650.00 to cover the cost of a composter and worm farm and other needed supplies for continued community education programs.
- Northside Elementary School in Union City received an education grant for \$700.00 which helped to cover the cost of taking all the 4th grade students to the Boonshoft Museum in Dayton, Ohio, which features a large display about recycling and composting.
- Two third grade teachers at Deerfield Elementary School received \$900.00 each to do a science project on the life cycle of plants and a look a pollinators, including a filed trip to Modoc Gardens to learn about sustainable agriculture.

- Heritage Environmental was able to pick up all our HHW from last year and what was collected in 2023, resulting in higher than usual disposal costs.
- The amount of electronics collected continues to decrease, due in part to the fact that most electronic devices are smaller and the assumption that most residents have now cleaned out all the old CRT televisions.
- Before Pollution Solution opened, district staff met with contract workers for training and discussion about general policies and procedures. Consequently, the facility seemed to be fairly well maintained and operated smoothly all year.
